

Having a COVID-19 vaccination





I am having my COVID-19 vaccination.



My vaccination will take place on a bus.



I will need to wear a face covering unless I am usually exempt from wearing one.



I will need to sanitise my hands before my appointment.



Staff working at the vaccination bus will also be helping to keep things clean.



I will be told which type of COVID-19 vaccine I will be having before I am vaccinated.



I might need to queue before my appointment.

I will need to make sure I keep some space between myself and the next person in the queue.



Someone will book me in for my vaccine appointment.



Then someone will ask me for my details, like my date of birth and my phone number, so they can make sure all the details are correct.

They will also ask for my NHS number. I can find this on any letters I have had from my doctor or hospital, or on my NHS card if I have it.



Someone else will check that I am happy to have my vaccination.

I can ask this person any questions I have about the vaccination if I have any worries.



Then I will go into the bus for my vaccination.



The vaccination will be quick and might feel like a sharp scratch.



I will be asked to wait for 15 minutes after my vaccination, just to make sure I feel OK.

If I do feel poorly I need to tell someone who works there.



I will be given a card that says which vaccination I have been given, and the date I had my vaccination.

I need to keep my card safe as I will need to bring it to my next appointment.

I might get a sticker too!

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
